What Sets Lutherans Apart?

This is a question that I am asked on a regular basis not only from strangers but also from many who regularly attend Lutheran churches. Most people are shocked when I start off by saying that we in no way worship or revere the 16th centurion theologian Martin Luther more than any other person. The only documents that Martin Luther wrote that we hold to be authoritative for Lutherans would be his small and large catechisms and the Smalcald Articles which are found in the Lutheran Confessions. Not only do we not worship him, but Martin Luther would be upset that we took his surname for the reformation movement he started. Luther would much rather us call ourselves Evangelicals which in Greek means "bearers of good news" because that is what the Lutheran movement is about.

So what is this good news that we are to be sharing? The answer is that we are saved by God's grace through faith and not by our own

actions. This means that we do not have to earn God's love and praise by our own works but that we freely receive God's love through the actions of his son Jesus Christ. So therefore you might be asking: is this some Lutheran concept that was explained in one of Luther's 95 Theses that he nailed to the Wittenberg Church door?

Actually, the concept comes not from Luther but from the writings of the Apostle Paul as he explains the gospel message to the Romans and Ephesians. The Apostle Paul in these two letters is explaining to the churches why Jesus' death and resurrection is good news for them and for everyone in the world. The problem though is that our human nature loves the idea of God's grace but struggles to understand the implication it has on our lives. The concept that God would in His great love give us the blessings of forgiveness, salvation and eternal life for free is hard for us to

grasp. We always are looking for what strings are attached to the gift because we must owe something. Over the centuries and even in the present day the church and its people easily fall into the trap of saying God's grace is free but we owe God this or that.

In 1517 Martin Luther did not come up with the concept of the message of Good News but he was the one who reminded the people of the life giving peace that God gives out of his great love for us. It is through the lens of God's graciousness that we as Lutherans strive to see God and God's people. This means that we shape our lives our worship and our relations with one another out of grace. If you want to know what this looks like from a practical stand point join me in my office during the Sunday School hour 9:45 am -10:30 am for a study on what it means to be Lutheran.

FROM YOUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT -

We have kicked off the fall calendar of events, so be sure to investigate the many ways you can participate with your fellow parishioners here at FLC. A few ideas include new Sunday School classes at 9:30 am for both youth and adults, Sunday evening youth activities, Pastor's Wednesday morning and Thursday evening classes (check the bulletin for updated schedule), Choir, Hand Bells, Women's Bible Study, and Men's Prayer Breakfast. These are fun, informative, and personally enriching opportunities, and I invite each of you to ask whether God is calling you to take the next step in your faith walk by joining in these and other activities. How will you know God is calling you? Pray for God's direction, and then listen patiently and quietly for His response.

Your church Finance Committee is ramping up the process of finalizing a budget proposal for 2020, which will be presented to the congregation at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, October 27th. This task will be very challenging this year. Even though the congregation approved this year's budget with a \$16,800 deficit, our

monthly General Fund expenses have been greater than our monthly income for most months of this year, with our year -to-date expenses currently around \$30,000 higher than our year-to-date income. Since we are not seeing an increasing trend in our average monthly offering, we will be looking closely at how to reduce expenses next year in order to present a balanced budget reflecting these lower income amounts. The cuts will be difficult, but we can only budget our expenses based on our history of actual income received. We pray and trust that each of you are contributing what you can to your monthly offering, and that is all we ask.

We have already been diligently searching for cost cutting measures, and will continue to implement changes that reduce unnecessary expenses. One example is adjusting the Sanctuary thermostats so the building's old air conditioning units aren't cooling the empty Sanctuary during the week (don't worry - no changes were made to the temperature on Sunday mornings). Keeping the Sanctuary at a constant 80 degrees Monday thru Saturday should provide a savings of \$300 per month during the hot summer months, and will reduce wear and tear on the old A/C

units. I'm sure more examples of cost saving opportunities will present themselves as we continue searching for them.

I am now going to ask each and every one of you to actively participate in our discernment process for creating next year's budget and finding ways to cut costs. How? I invite you to please pray about this. Pray for God's guidance for our Finance Committee and Council to see what He has planned for us, and how we can be good and faithful stewards of His gifts of time, talent, and money. We have been richly blessed with beautiful worship facilities, an absolutely wonderful Pastor (and family!), and a loving congregation. Pray that we can honor Him with our stewardship of these blessings.

Please pray.





