Hearing the Resurrection Story Again by Pastor Ian Reid

One of the things that happens to us as Christians is that in time we become easily jaded to the impact of what Jesus truly did for us and how He transformed the world as we know it. The stories of the Bible instead of being "words of eternal life" as the Gospel writer John states, become stories that we gloss over and treat as tales of a somewhat glorious past. The great stories of Jesus and His amazing ministry of teaching, healing and sharing love and grace to the poor, outcasts and needy get relegated to virtues for which we can strive if we are so inclined. When we do this the church becomes less about a body of people who are in awe of God, and more like a club you can join that teaches good morals with hopeful endings.

So what can we Christians do about this problem of complacency that creeps in slowly and starts by dulling our senses so we are satisfied with the way things seem? I believe the answer is by taking a new and earnest look at what scriptures tell us about the resurrection experience. I know that the Bible is a lot more than just the Easter message, but at the same time I cannot think of any greater story to truly transform a person

from an onlooker of Christ to a believer.

The disciples who had been devoted to following Jesus around Galilee and Judea for three years as well as several women woke up Easter morning expecting nothing new to happen. Yes, they had heard Jesus explicitly say that He would die and on the third day rise again, (Matthew 16:21) but really who could understand what that truly meant? It was not as if people died and rose every day or even on rare occasions. This idea that you would come back from the dead even if you could do miracles and speak about God with great authority was ludicrous.

On the day of Jesus' resurrection one would have thought that Peter, James and John would have been right down by the tomb so they could have had front row seats. Instead they were hiding out wondering about their next move. Even the faithful women who were going to tend to Jesus' body were more worried about rolling back the cover of the tomb than they were dealing with the consequences of a resurrected Lord who could not be contained by the grave. Truly, I believe the disciples were a lot like us. They knew the stories well

but when it came time to apply them they struggled do so because until we experience resurrection it is hard to grasp its fullness.

The Easter story is simply not just about Jesus rising from the dead but it also has the implication that death has been conquered and we are now set free. The disciples whose great fear of death, which led them to leave Jesus' side when He needed them most, have fled. They will now travel around the known world and share the Good News of Christ's death and resurrection that brings about new life in us. The women who came to place spices on a corpse will leave a tomb that is empty with the knowledge that God is not there because He will go before them along their journey just as He had promised before. Even the guards of the tomb who mocked and jeered Him left the tomb in shock and amazement.

Therefore during this Easter season we have a choice; we can go into the season not expecting anything new to change and it will come and pass as usual, or we can open our eyes to the promises of God and be changed by the risen Lord.

First Lutheran Upgrades

We will be seeing a lot of activity around our church very soon. Our loan was finalized on March 6th and we signed the contract with McHenry Electric on the 10th. The Sanctuary hearing assistance loop agreement was approved on the 17th and is being scheduled for installation. We are reviewing the bell tower roof upgrade and will be scheduling the replacement when the

weather permits. The engineering of the Sanctuary lighting upgrades is nearing completion.

McHenry Electric has ordered the initial equipment needed and will be starting from the power inlet to our church in the basement of the education building and will replace six circuit breaker boxes and the cloth backed wiring throughout our church. The final phase will be replacing the chandelier wiring and installing additional lights for our choir and altar areas.

We have received \$25,101 so far! This is a tremendous start! As we discussed, every dollar we donate till September 6th we will not have to borrow. Let's all pitch in and help!
