The Church Experience

One of the things that I find so interesting is that most people today when asked about their church describe only the worship life. They usually respond by telling me what kind of music is played at the service or if their pastor is a good preacher. They might discuss whether there are young families present, or more likely, the lack of attendance by young people. The one thing that I have noted in my conversations with others is that those who are actively involved in the life of the church tend to speak most highly of it.

Now this leads to the proverbial question of which came first-the chicken or the egg? Many people would argue that those who have invested their time and energy into the church will rate their satisfaction higher, because their commitment level is higher. I would argue that the opposite is the truth. That is because by definition both worship and the church are not meant to be things, but instead actions in which the faithful partake.

Both the writer of Acts and Paul make it quite clear that the followers of Christ are not meant to be inanimate objects that God works upon, but instead are to be God's hands and feet. Our worship is the belief that we take part in giving thanks and praise to a God who is worthy to be praised. Martin Luther 500 years ago worked hard to change the service from one in which the clergy led it completely to one in which the people of God jointly worshiped Him. This led to such reforms as the congregation singing, lay people reading the lessons and even the prayers of the people being lifted up to God. At First Lutheran we already provide a wide variety of ways in which one can participate in the service and not all mean standing up before the congregation. I am always willing to sit down with anyone and discuss where their gifts, talents and or desires to serve merge with the work of the church.

Speaking of the church it is not something that functions only on Sunday mornings. The Greek word that is translated into church actually means fellowship of believers. In Acts we find that the early church gathered together on a regular basis not only for worship but also to eat together, to care for the poor amongst them and to spend time with one another. The reason that gathering together was so important to the early church was because that is the way they came to know each other and form strong bonds. It is hard to feel like a family if you do not know the other people around you, and

by working together and fellowship they developed deep connections

At First Lutheran there are many tasks in which you can easily partake for the good of the church that do not take vast amounts of time, which I promise you will not have to do endlessly. While you are assisting the church and the people in the community you will find not only joy in helping but also in getting to know the people with whom you worhship on Sunday. As Luther states, God does not need us to do His work in the world, but He allows us to be a part of it so that we might find joy in the experience.

My hope for you is that you will think about ways you can be a part of the work of the church either on Sunday or throughout the week. If you need help to discern how you may best use your gifts and talents to the glory of God, feel free to speak with me. On the other hand, if you have been doing a task at the church and feel that it is time to move on let me know as well. I completely understand and would want vou to assess what God is calling you to do even if that means giving up something.

May God Bless us as we work together as a community and love one another.

Pastor will be leaving on an important mission February 9 – a visit with our sister synod in Madagascar – traveling with Bishop Riegel who is making his first visit there. They will be making a side trip to Finland to deliver the Sister Church Relationship Covenant to our sister church Rekolan Seurakunta in Vantaa, Finland.

Pastor will return from abroad just in time to catch his breath and get us moving right into the Lenten season. "Fat Tuesday" is February 28 and we will celebrate with the usual fabulous pancake supper. The season of Lent begins the next day with the celebration of Ash Wednesday, March 1, with services at noon and 7 pm. We will have our traditional Wednesday Lenten services at 12:30 and 7 pm, each preceded by lunch at 11:30 am, or light evening meal at 6 pm. All mid-day services will be at First Lutheran, and we will continue to share evening services with Christ Lutheran: 7pm at First on March 8, 22 and April 5, and at Christ on March 15 and 29. We encourage you to come and enjoy the food and fellowship, and to participate in these special Lenten services.

Maintenance of our (I hate to say it) aging facility is ongoing. You have been hearing hints about what is, or may be, on the horizon ... and we will continue to advise you of our efforts to keep our entire facility perking along in good order.

The electrical upgrade project is complete and we are making strides in paying down the loan. Please continue to contribute to this project as you are able.

Lunch on Tuesdays

Each Tuesday, we provide a lunch for the men from the correctional facility who receive community service hours by volunteering at our church. They do odd jobs around the church through the winter and help in the gardens in the other seasons. (Thursday is also a work day in seasons beyond winter) The men from the church who volunteer also eat with the men. They break for lunch at 12:30 pm.

Will you share your cooking with these men for a meal? It could simply be dropping off a casserole or lasagna on Sunday or Monday with reheating directions. Someone else can take care of setting the meal up! OR

You could bring lunch over (or even prepare it in the kitchen!) and set up the buffet for the men to go through when it's time to eat. There is usually ice cream in the large freezer that the men enjoy as an easy dessert.

This is a very interesting ministry. It gives these men, some of whom have been incarcerated for years, an opportunity to talk to you about their lives, about their families, to sit without fear of others. They are people, like you and me, who have made poor choices. However, they also can see that we care for them by the time we spend eating and talking over this meal. I think your eyes would be opened and your heart blessed if you would provide a meal.

Marilyn and I would like to express our deep appreciation for the cards and prayers during my nine week stay in St. Paul, Mn. Hospitals. We have often talked about the love and affection we have received from the congregation over the years that we have been members.

The doctors who treated me told me that I was lucky to survive. They also told me that my recovery went very well. We believe that the prayers on our behalf played an important role.

For those of you not familiar with Myasthenia Gravis (I had never heard of it before) it is an autoimmune disorder in which the signal to the nerves is blocked preventing muscles from functioning properly and becoming weaker. The effects of the disease combined with nine weeks in bed have left me very weak. I am getting stronger every day and am getting around well using a walker.

I am continuing to be treated for my immune system disorder and for my weakened swallowing muscles. As soon as my immune system has recovered to the point where we feel safe in a crowd we will be back in church.
